CONGREGATIONAL SUMMER ASSEMBLY (CSA) SOUND TECHNICIAN

Supervisory Function: None

Purpose: The Sound Technician is responsible for setting up, operating, and maintaining audio equipment; ensuring clear and effective sound during church services, musical performances, and special events, often collaborating with the Choir Director and Operetta Producer/Director to achieve desired sound levels and mixes. Sets up microphones and troubleshoots any technical issues that arise during a recording or live performance.

Job Type: Seasonal/Part-Time - weekly church service, Adult and Children's Operettas, and 3 summer concerts.

Skill and Knowledge Requirements:

- Knowledge of and interest in broadcast and recorded sound
- Technical ability in operating sound equipment
- Understanding of the physics of sound, technical aptitude including an awareness of current sound technology and equipment, good aural skills
- Excellent communication skills and attention to detail

Essential Functions:

- Pre-Event Setup: Arrive early to set up microphones, speakers, mixing boards, and other sound equipment
- Sound Checks: Perform thorough sound checks, including gain settings, monitor mixes, and proper volume levels
- Live Sound Mixing: Operate mixing boards and other sound devices to ensure clear and balanced sound
- Troubleshooting: Quickly identify and resolve any audio issues that arise during services or events
- Equipment Maintenance: Ensure the proper maintenance and upkeep of all audio equipment
- Collaboration: Work closely with the Choir Director and Operetta Producer/Director to understand their needs and goals for sound and music
